#### **Cosmetic Surgeon John Fezza, M.D. to Provide One-on-One Training in Nonsurgical Facial Rejuvenation**

SARASOTA, FL -- July 8, 2010 -- Clinicians with an interest in expanding their knowledge and technical skill in performing aesthetic procedures are invited to attend an advanced instructional program with Oculo-facial Plastic Surgeon John P. In addition, he is an ad hoc preceptor for the American Society of Ophthalmic Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery (ASOPRS) at Vanderbilt University. He is certified by the American Board of Ophthalmology and the American Board of Cosmetic Surgery and is a member of ASOPRS (American Society of Ophthalmic Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery).

In addition to being the author of numerous articles appearing in medical journals such as Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery, American Journal of Cosmetic Surgery, and Ophthalmic Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery, Dr. Fezza has also been featured in other publications such as Elle magazine and Cosmetic Surgery Times. Dr. Fezza has also been a guest and medical expert on several daytime TV shows on ABC, NBC, CBS, and FOX networks. He is a reviewer for several journals and presenter at many medical national meetings. His research interests include advances in facial cosmetic surgical techniques as well as expertise in facial fillers and botulinum toxin injections.
